The first Sunday in August is American Family Day and Friendship Day. It is also National Kid's Day which was created in 1994. Kid's Day is a day to spend meaningful time with children and coincides perfectly with American Family Day and Friendship Day. National Night Out is observed on the first **Tuesday** in August. This yearly event was introduced in 1984 and is a night for neighborhoods to get together with block parties, cookouts, parades and police visits. It is also a night that encourages participation in anti-crime efforts in towns and cities across America.

FOR YOUR HEALTH



Sweltering summer temperatures continue throughout this summer with the National Weather Service issuing an excessive heat warning for a wide region stretching from the Washington, D.C., area to the Ohio Valley.

Health officials warn that the high temperatures and oppressive humidity mean older adults, in particular, need to take precautions. People age 65 and older are more prone to heat-related problems, says the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, because their bodies don't adjust as well to changes in temperature.

Seniors are also more likely to have a chronic condition that can affect their ability to deal with high heat, especially if they don't have air-conditioning at home.

Older adults — and friends and family members who check on them — need to be aware of the signs of dehydration, heat exhaustion and heat stroke. These include nausea, dizziness, muscle cramps, weakness and rapid breathing and pulse.

In addition, here are steps older adults can take to protect their health during this hot, sticky season:

- Drink cool, nonalcoholic beverages. Avoid caffeine.
- Take it easy. Don't engage in strenuous activities.
- Take a cool shower, bath, or sponge bath, or place cool, wet cloths on your neck and under your armpits. •
- If possible, seek an air-conditioned environment. (If you don't have air conditioning, consider visiting an airconditioned shopping mall, public library or one of the cooling stations that many cities are setting up to help residents.)
- Wear lightweight clothing and a brimmed hat to shade your face.
- Cover windows that get direct sun that can heat your home.
- If possible, remain indoors during afternoon hours, the peak heat of the day. Do errands in the early • morning.
- Check on older neighbors or relatives at least twice a day for signs of heat stroke or heat exhaustion.
- **Don't forget about your pets!** Pets can get dehydrated quickly, so give them plenty of fresh, clean water when it's hot outdoors. Make sure your pets have a shady place to get out of the sun, be careful to not overexercise them, and keep them indoors when it's extremely hot.
