AARP CEO Responds to Obama's Deficit Reduction Proposal "Social Security did not cause the deficit and should not be cut." Source: AARP Bulletin | July 7, 2011

**AARP CEO Barry Rand** released a statement **July 7**, **2011** in response to a report in the Washington Post that the White House was open to making cuts in programs such as **Social Security** and **Medicare** to reach an agreement with Republicans before the August 2 deadline to raise the nation's debt ceiling.

"AARP will not accept any cuts to Social Security as part of a deal to pay the nation's bills," said Rand. "Social Security did not cause the deficit, and it should not be cut to reduce a deficit it did not cause. As the President and Congress work to negotiate a deal to raise the debt ceiling, AARP urges all lawmakers to reject any proposals that would cut the benefits seniors have earned through a lifetime of hard work.

"AARP is strongly opposed to any deficit reduction proposal that makes harmful cuts to vital Social Security and Medicare benefits. Social Security is currently the principal source of income for nearly two-thirds of older American households receiving benefits, and roughly one third of those households depend on Social Security benefits for nearly all (90 percent or more) of their income. The deficit debate is not the time or the place to talk about Social Security. AARP will fight any cuts that are proposed to this important program, including proposals to reduce the cost of living adjustment for beneficiaries (COLA) — such as the proposed chained CPI — which AARP also believes should not be considered as part of the debt ceiling or deficit reduction negotiations."

In a budget proposal offered in April, President Obama vowed opposition to any cuts in Social Security or Medicare.

So the report that the White House might be considering changes to the popular programs caused shock waves in Washington. A few hours after the Washington Post story, the White House appeared to be clarifying the president's position, with a White House official who is close to the negotiations telling the Huffington Post that the Washington Post story "overshoots the runway." The official continued: *"The President said in the State of the Union that he wanted a bipartisan process to strengthen Social Security in a balanced way that preserves the promise of the program and doesn't slash benefits."* ggd ③



The Cancer Screening That 22 Million Still Need To Get Source: AARP Blog | July 15, 2011

Americans between the ages of 50 and 75 are at the highest risk for colon cancer, yet one out of three — about 22 million — still haven't gotten screened for this deadly disease.

**Many have done the right thing**, thanks in part to publicity about screening by some well-known TV personalities. As a result, deaths from colon cancer have greatly decreased.

As for the other 22 million folks – well, federal officials at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are very disappointed in you.

Here's why: Screening can find precancerous growths, called polyps, in the colon that can be removed before they turn into cancer. Of the cancers that affect both men and women, colorectal cancer is the number two killer in the U.S.

Those most at risk for colorectal cancer include all adults between 50 and 75, as well as those with a family history of the disease or who suffer from Crohn's disease and other intestinal disorders, according to the CDC.

**Following high-profile urging by celebrities** like former CBS Evening News anchor **Katie Couric**, whose husband died from the disease, the number of people getting screened for colon cancer has dramatically increased since 1997, when just 40 percent of older Americans got tested.

As of 2010, two out of three older Americans were up to date on their colon cancer screening. The CDC says screening prevented 66,000 colorectal cancers between 2003 and 2007 and saved 16,000 lives, compared to 2002.

If you're on Medicare, colorectal cancer screening is covered under the new health care law, but coverage under private plans may vary while government regulators get things sorted out. The best idea is to check with your insurance provider to see what screening they'll cover. ggd ©
