Special Services (Continued): As a special service, AARP Driver Safety volunteers will also provide a CarFit check at the event. A proper "fit" can greatly increase your safety as a driver and can protect other motorists. This includes changes such as adjusting the position of the gas/brake pedal, the distance between the steering wheel and your chest, your line of sight above the steering wheel, and much more.



Community members never need to leave their car! Volunteers will direct them to drive through the parking lot to each service, assist them in removing the shredding and recycled items from their cars, and accept the food items for donation. (ARP Georgia)



Headed for an AARP shredding, recycling event? Here's a list of stuff to bring...



Whether it's spring cleaning or a fall clean-up, AARP Georgia makes it easy to get rid of stuff you don't need.

In April, AARP Georgia will host popular document shredding and electronics recycling events in Athens, Newnan, Warner Robins and Kennesaw. Community members can bring confidential papers to be shredded – outdated checks, receipts, tax returns, etc., that are no longer needed – and old computers, laptops, fax machines and much more — to be recycled

The cost? Absolutely free with a donation of non-perishable food items that can be contributed (on your behalf) to a local food ministry.

Focus first on those documents that, if they were tossed in the trash, would compromise your financial security. Identity thieves need little – a checking account number, old credit card receipts with your account number, utility bills showing your account number and address. Gather up all those old confidential papers and bring them for shredding.

Acceptable electronics items include (But Not Limited To):

- Personal computers, laptop computers and computer modems.
- External computer disk drives, printers and UPS (uninterruptible power supply) batteries. (They're heavy; much heavier than a simple power strip.)
- CD-ROMs, fax machines, copiers, home telephones, and cell phones.
- Circuit boards.
- Personal computer power supplies, home document shredders, computer keyboards and computer mice.
- Stereos, videocassette recorders and players, CD players
- Typewriters.
- Document scanners.
- Electronic test equipment.
- Microwaves.
- Personal computer monitors and computer cables.
- Clothes washers and dryers and kitchen stoves.

Please note: For guicker service on site, please remove all cabling from your devices and place the cables in a bag.

Also please note, due to bulk, weight and complexity, our electronics recycler will charge \$10 to recycle television sets and cathode ray tube (CRT) computer desktop monitors.

Unacceptable items (Not All Inclusive):

- Console or projection TV sets.
- Car batteries.
- Tools.
- Toasters, refrigerators, freezers, vacuum cleaners, humidifiers, blenders, mixers or tires.
- Gas-powered tools.
- · Household Trash.





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
